#### Why an e-book?

Because technology helps explaining adoption in a more efficient way. Animations, multi-language voiceover, and interactivity help the reader access the ebook contents and allow the child to become active in the story.

#### From child... to child!

It is child-friendly because the reader is taught about what adoption is by other children who have been adopted themsleves. The story is developed around their own words: from child to child.



#### Addressed to whom?

This e-book is primarily addressed to children waiting for adoption. Due to its stimulating nature, also adopted children, children in general, parents, professionals and teachers can benefit from using it.

#### A tool beyond borders

The chance to set different languages allows reading it both in the Country of origin and, later on, in that of adoption. It builds bridges between past and future but also between professionals in different continents.

### What is it about?

It is an e-book dedicated to everyone rotating around the world of adoption: children, parents, professionals. Through 10 different chapters, it tells the story of Moïse, an African child who is about to be adopted. It describes the events typical of every adoption step, leaving space also for emotions and questions appearing in the young protagonist's mind. In an imaginary and symbolic way Moïse can interact with children who have already been adopted who help him finding answers and legitimate his feelings. "Everything is going to be fine, Moise!" is their way to help him not to loose his hope.
